Voters to Decide on Local Sales Tax Measure



Diamond Bar voters will decide in November whether or not to approve Measure DB, an additional three-quarters-of-a-cent sales tax to help fund local needs and priorities.

If approved, Measure DB is estimated to generate approximately \$3.8 million in local funds that could be used for everything from parks and trails, public safety and crime prevention, and street repairs and infrastructure maintenance.

The current sales tax is 9.50 percent in Diamond Bar, of which the City receives 1 percent – the rest goes to the state and county. The increase would bring up this rate to 10.25 percent. Most cities in Los Angeles County have sales tax rates ranging from 10 percent to 10.25 percent.

Live Online Informational Presentation on Measure DB

Ahead of the November 2020 election, the City is hosting an online presentation to provide information and answer questions regarding Measure DB, which if approved could generate an additional \$3.8 million of local funding to support essential City services and address currently unfunded community needs and priorities.

The informational presentation will be offered on Wednesday, September 16 at 6:30 p.m. and again Saturday, September 19 at 10:30 a.m. Pre-registration is required. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email with instructions on how to join the presentation.

In-Person Recreation Classes Health and Safety Protocols

In addition to virtual programming, the Parks and Recreation Department is again offering a variety of in-person recreation classes! The following health and safety protocols are in place for all in-person recreation classes:

- Classes will be held outdoors.
- Size of classes will be limited to ensure adequate distancing between all participants.
- All staff and participants will be required to take a health questionnaire and temperature screening upon arrival.
- Face coverings will be required for all staff and participants.
- Areas of regular use and high touch surfaces will be frequently disinfected during and between each class.
- When hand washing is not an option or not convenient, hand sanitizer will be made available.
- Signage will be visibly posted to remind everyone to follow all state and county health mandates.

Temporary Outdoor Services Permits



Temporary outdoor services permits continue to be available free of charge to restaurants, fitness establishments, and businesses offering personal care services such as barbershops and hair and nail salons.

The permit makes it possible for businesses to stay open by allowing them to serve customers outdoors in compliance with state and county public health directives during the COVID-19 pandemic.

There is no fee for this permit or any other permit or plan check associated with setting up for outdoor business operations, however, a detailed diagram is required showing the proposed placement of tables, chairs, shade structures and other furnishings as well as traffic control devices such as cones or barricades.

Also, American's with Disability Act (ADA), pedestrian and emergency access must be maintained in all cases, and applicants must continue to meet all county health and fire regulations, and activities must be approved by the appropriate licensing agency such as California's Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) that oversees licensing and regulation for bar and restaurant alcohol consumption, and the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology that licenses and regulates the barbering or cosmetology industry.

Census Non-Response Follow-Up Visits Now Underway

The U.S. Census Bureau is following up in person with households that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census. Non-response follow-up is the Census Bureau's one last push to encourage everyone to be counted.

Participating in the national Census, which is conducted every ten years, is mandated by law and the information is directly tied to representation in the political system, distribution of billions of federal funds for health and education programs, and other quality of life matters such as where homes, roads and schools are built and public transit routes are established.

As of mid-August, the self-response rate in Diamond Bar was 76.7 percent. If your household has not completed the Census and you are visited by a Census taker, be prepared to take approximately 10-15 questions to answer the questionnaire in person.

Census takers work between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m., including weekends, and can be identified by a valid government ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date on the badge. To confirm a census taker's identity, the public may contact the regional census center at (213) 314-6500 to speak with a Census Bureau representative.

Alternative, you can complete the Census online by visiting <https://2020census.gov> or by telephone by calling (844) 330-2020 before the end of this month. It takes less than 10 minutes to answer nine simple questions about the age, gender, ethnicity, race of every member of the household as well as anyone else staying in the house on April 1, 2020, and whether you own or rent your home.

All Census results will be collected by September 30 so that they can be processed and released as statistics by December 31, as required by law.

Nov. 3 General Municipal Election

The next Diamond Bar General Municipal Election will be held November 3, 2020. Registered voters will be electing two members of the City Council and vote on a local sales tax ballot measure (Measure DB).

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, all registered voters regardless of whether they registered to vote by mail will receive a Vote by Mail ballot, however, in-person voting will still be an option.

As a reminder, earlier this year, Los Angeles County transitioned from polling centers to Vote Centers which allow voters to cast a ballot at any vote center 10 days prior to Election Day through close of voting on Election Day.

West Nile Virus Still Active

Summer may almost be over but mosquito activity is still at its peak and expected to continue into early fall. That is why it continues to be imperative that everyone do their part to reduce the number of mosquitoes around their home, and take steps to avoid mosquito bites.



West Nile virus (WNV) is a potentially deadly disease that is transmitted through the bite of a mosquito that acquired the virus by feeding on an infected bird. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, most people infected with WNV will not experience any illness. However, about 1 in 5 individuals who are infected will experience mild symptoms such as body aches, fever, skin rash joint pain, and 1 out of 150 infected people will become seriously ill with tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, and numbness. In rare cases, WNV can lead to paralysis, coma or death. Persons older than 60 years of age are at greater risk of developing severe disease.

The best way to prevent West Nile disease or any other mosquito-borne illness is to take the following precautions:

- Apply mosquito repellent to exposed skin before going outdoors and reapply as recommended on the label.
- Wear insect repellent containing CDC and EPA approved active ingredients: DEET®, Picaridin, IR3535, or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- Wear light-colored, long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Close or repair all unscreened doors and windows to prevent mosquitoes from entering the home.

Also:

- Eliminate standing water in clogged rain gutters, rain barrels, discarded tires, buckets, or anything that holds water for more than a week.
- Ensure that swimming pools, spas, and ponds are properly maintained.
- Regularly change the water in pet dishes, birdbaths, and other small containers. If the water has been standing for more than a week, scrub and rinse the container before refilling.
- Report neglected (green) swimming pools in your neighborhood or a breeding source located in a public area to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (GLACVCD) by calling (562) 944-9656 or completing a service request online at <https://www.glacvcd.org/>.



2020 **Disasters Don't Wait. MAKE YOUR PLAN TODAY.**

Preparing for an emergency may seem like an insurmountable task if taken all at once which is why this year the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Ready Campaign encourages individuals and families to tackle the four key tasks in weekly chunks.

Week 1: Make a Plan

Talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster.

Week 2: Build a Kit

Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly.

Week 3: Prepare for Disasters


Limit the impacts that disasters have on you and your family. Know the risk of disasters in your area and check your insurance coverage. Learn how to make your home stronger in the face of common hazards and act fast if you receive a local warning or alert.

Week 4: Teach Youth About Preparedness

Talk to your children and teens about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved.

Launched in 2003, the Ready Campaign is a national public service campaign aimed at helping American people to prepare for, respond to and mitigate disasters and emergencies. COVID-19 Dashboard Maps

Staying informed on the latest regarding the COVID-19 public health emergency can be challenging because of its uncertain and fast-changing nature, however, Los Angeles County's suite of interactive maps and dashboards make it easier. Accessible at <https://covid19.lacounty.gov/dashboards/>, these dashboards display information such as case counts and rates by community, and closures and openings of parks, trails and beaches, as well as maps to locate free resources such as testing sites, WiFi spots, cooling centers, and meals for students and older adults.

Reporting COVID-19 Business Violations

The Los Angeles County Health Officer Order requires businesses to adopt measures to protect the health of employees and customers and prevent the spread of COVID-19 such as disinfecting frequently-touched surfaces and objects preventing crowds from gathering, eliminating unnecessary contact, and keeping people at least six feet apart. Additionally, as of mid-July, hair and nail salons, gyms, and other close-contact services like indoor dining at restaurants were required to either suspend their operations or move them outdoors.

If you have observed a business not following one or more of these mandates, you can report them to the County's Environmental Health Division of the Department of Public Health:

Be prepared to provide location, date and time as well as a brief description of the violation and photos if you have them. Reports will be reviewed and if deemed necessary will be assigned to inspector who will visit the business and provide guidance of the Public Health Order protocols.

As of last month, businesses that do not comply with the protocols will be fined \$100 for the first offense and \$500 for additional offenses, with multiple offenses potentially resulting in a 30-day permit suspension.

City Facilities, Services and Operations During COVID-19



City Hall and the Diamond Bar Center remain closed to the public until further notice,

however many City services remain available online, by email, or over the phone. Additionally, essential City operations such as public safety services, trash and recycling collection, street sweeping, road repair and maintenance, park and trail upkeep, and tree trimming and landscaping continue as scheduled.

Among the City services available remotely are the following:

Service requests can be made for everything from graffiti to abandoned shopping carts, potholes to buckling sidewalks, and burned out street lights to damaged street signs.

Building Permits and Inspections

Building permits, including permits requiring plan review, are available by completing and submitting an online application. Examples of projects that require permits are the installation or replacement of a central air conditioner or furnace, the upgrade of an electrical panel, the construction of patios, pools or walls, as well as room additions and accessory dwelling units (ADUs).

Engineering Reviews and Inspections

Construction projects (residential, commercial and industrial) within the city require plan checks, inspections and sometimes stormwater compliance reviews and encroachment permits. Public Works staff is available to help by phone and the fee schedule and all applicable forms are available on the City website.

In terms of recreational facilities and amenities:

City parks and trails are open for passive use (walking, jogging or hiking), public restrooms are available, and the dog park at Pantera Park and tennis and pickleball courts have reopened for use while practicing physical distancing. Still closed at this time are all playgrounds, basketball courts, picnic areas, and the skate park at Peterson Park.
